Meet The Board: Ken Colson



Mr. Colson is a Native Son, born in San Francisco, a graduate of the University of California, Berkeley and San Francisco State University. He is now an Emeritus Professor of Anthropology and Sociology from West Valley Community College, Saratoga, California.

At West Valley College Ken taught introductory courses in cultural, physical, and linguistic anthropology and sociology. He was the department chair of the combined departments of Sociology, Anthropology, Geography, and Economics. Upon retirement he served as the chair at West Valley College of the Department of the Administration of Justice and the Director of the law enforcement training program for the Santa Clara County Office of the Sheriff, Probation Department, and the Department of Corrections.

His honors include a Fulbright-Hays Fellowship, Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok, Thailand, and at Jadavpur University, Calcutta, India. A National Endowment for the Humanities Fellowship at the University of Southern Illinois, Carbondale, an NEH sponsored field program in Archeology and Education, Santa Barbara, California, and an NEH Grant to conduct a survey of California Native Americans settlement sites in the Santa Clara Valley, California.

Mr. Colson authored a published paper in the Society of California Anthropology on Tattoos and Death in America as well as authoring and editing chapters on the culture and social structure of Taiwan and the Peoples Republic of China for the Office of Human Relations, San Jose, California.

He is currently involved in community service and public projects in his neighborhood; serving as a Director on the board of the Burbank Sanitary, San Jose, California.

Ken's varied first hand experiences as a volunteer includes 23 years as a firefighter/lieutenant in the Saratoga California Fire Department, post-war home reconstruction in Pakrac, Croatia, building a new facility for rehabilitation of the disabled for PROESA Santa Ana Chapitiro, Mexico, a summer ESL program in Siennica, Poland, and the rehabilitation of an historic chestnut mill in Corsica


